


The Master Code Enforcement Professional Certification is for individuals who possess the skills required to show they are at the top of their field in Code Enforcement. To hold the prestigious title of Master Code Enforcement Professional, an individual must be certified as an ICC/AACE Certified Code Enforcement Officer, the ICC/AACE Certified Code Enforcement Administrator, the ICC Certified Residential Building Inspector, and complete the National Incident Management System (NIMS) courses: ICS-100, ICS-200, ICS-300, ICS-400, IS-700 and IS-800. There is an additional fee required when you submit your application to AACE for this prestigious title, along with proof of your current required certifications. EduCode Celebrates 20 Years

EduCode began in the middle 1990's as an idea when the Southern Nevada Chapter of the International Conference of Building Officials (ICBO) officers and members met to discuss the training needs for the chapter in southern Nevada.



The chapter officials said let's "go big." The plan was to develop a multi-day format and a three-day training program was proposed. Greg Franklin, Clark County Building Department, and past ICBO Chapter President, was the first chair of our "Institute."

The planning for the first program began in 1997. The first training program was called "Annual Code Education Institute" and was held February 10-13, 1998 at the Riviera Hotel and Casino, Las Vegas, Nevada.

In 2004, AACE (Sherri Johnston) and SNICC (Greg Franklin) worked out a contract for AACE to do facilitate the code enforcement track for the five-day session each year. The Southern Nevada Chapter of the International Code Council pays AACE \$10,000.00 to take care of the code enforcement track. AACE, in turn, pays for instructors to come to Las Vegas to teach either half-day or full-day classes. This year we helped celebrate 20 Years of EduCode on March 20-24, 2017. EduCode 2018 will be March 19-23, 2018 and The Orleans Hotel in Las Vegas. Should you have any questions concerning EduCode contact Sherri Johnston at sherjohnston@outlook.com.
